



## Primary Care COVID-19 Immunization Clinic Toolkit

### What is COVIDtoolkit.ca?

COVIDtoolkit.ca is a website to help primary care offices across Canada find information about COVID-19 vaccines and how to plan immunization clinics in their offices.

### Who is COVIDtoolkit.ca for?

The toolkit was written for primary care providers and primary care offices across Canada. The toolkit has materials that will help if you are: supporting patients making decisions about getting vaccinated or if you are planning to give COVID-19 immunizations in your office.

### What's in COVIDtoolkit.ca?

The toolkit is divided into four sections:

1. **Inform and Identify Patients:** immunization status, engaging vaccine hesitant patients, resources to update patients, identifying eligible patients and key populations. This section is useful for all primary care offices, whether you are planning your own Immunization Clinic or not.
2. **Plan Your Immunization Clinic:** this section has tools to help determine your clinic's capacity for immunization (e.g. number of patients to book), downloadable resources to prepare a clinic and support planning the details of your clinic, including example checklists.
3. **Run Your Immunization Clinic:** what is needed the day before immunization, how to manage the day of immunization, and how to wrap up an immunization clinic.
4. **Follow Up with Your Patients:** This section helps with how to follow up with missed patients, and monitor side effects and adverse events.

In each section we have pulled together specific tools, plus links to national and provincial materials.

### How the toolkit was developed

The Primary Care [Innovation Support Unit](#) created COVIDtoolkit.ca to help primary care clinics support the COVID-19 immunization effort. The toolkit was developed with the support of a pan-Canadian collaboration (including [BC Primary Health Care Research Network](#), [Canadian Primary Care Sentinel Surveillance Network](#), [University of Manitoba](#), [19 to Zero](#), [Centre for Effective Practice](#), [Canadian College of Family Physicians](#) and others), aligning with PHAC guidelines, NACI's recommendations, best-practices, evidence, and key stakeholder feedback. The first version of covidtoolkit.ca was released March 5, 2021.
